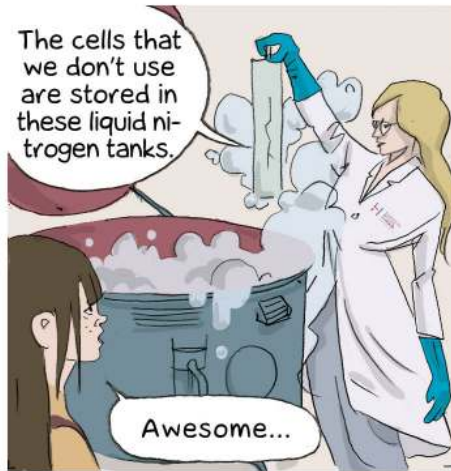
However, chemotherapy is a treatment that has a lot of unpleasant side effects for the patient.



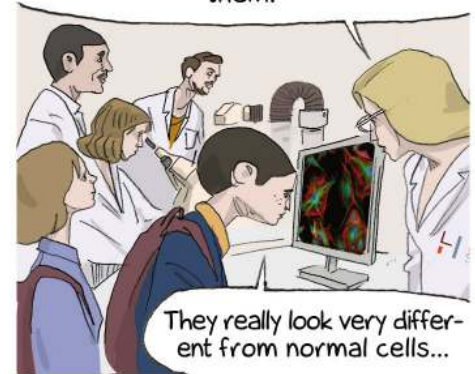
This is where we feed the cells, in a sterile environment. We've taken them from malignant tumors that are cancerous.



The cells that we don't use are stored in these liquid nitrogen tanks.



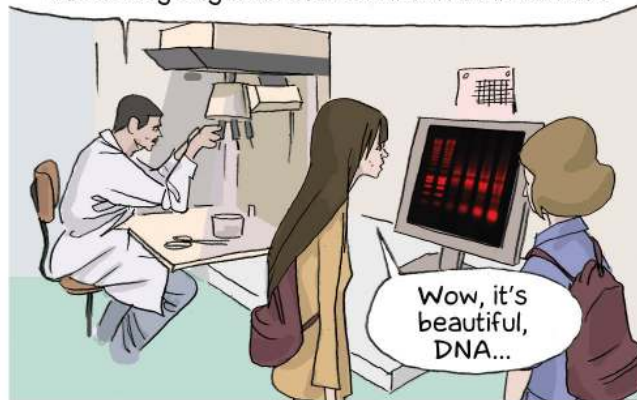
As the cells are minuscule, we use powerful microscopes to observe them.
